		talking bout a, you know, so and so," you know.

		"Yeah." Said, "I thought so." [Cause you sounds just]

		adored her, I stuck to her like glue, so I talked like her since

		undersatnd me.

39	IC	= But that Southern twang, it comes out every now and then.
40	TP	Wow. So "YOUNTZ" and, and =
41	IC	= "YOUNTZ" is a [()]
42	TP	[What about "YINZ"] is that the same thing?]
43	IC	"YOUNTZ," yeah, "YOUNTZ" and "Y'ALL," that's the same
		thing
44	TP	Mmhm.
45	IC	but I use them both,
46	TP	Mmhm.
47	IC	depending on what part of me coming out, you know. ((laughs))
48	TP	Okay. ((laughs)) What about "NEBBY?" "NEBBY?" Is that a
		word that you use [()]?
49	IC	[Mmhm.] There's a lot of "NEBBY" folks up there where I'm at,
50	TP	= ((laughs)) =
51	IC	= cause I like em being "NEBBY," cause they wash my house
52		((both laugh))

68	IC	[Mmmhmmm.] And "PISS-," "PI-," "PISS-," too,

70	IC	"PISSBURGH." ((laughs))
71	TP	Oh, really?
72	IC	((both laugh)) Yeah, I heard all of that, [yeah,] and I guess I'm kinda guilty, depending on how I'm slurring my words, yeah, it comes out.

80	IC	Yes, in the different areas, yes there's different, depending on the different area that you lived in.

84	IC	When you're with your buddies =
85	TP	= Unhunh. =
86	IC	= and homegirls and stuff. They're different in each little part of town.
87	TP	Okay. =
88	IC	= Because really if you, like the Hill people
89	TP	Mmhm. =
90	IC	= even though the projects up there like was part of the Hill
91	TP	Unhunh. =
92	IC	= They had, they talked and, and dressed a little different than we did that lived basically in the <u>heart</u> of the Hill
93	TP	Okay.
94	IC	Cause they was like further over, they wasn't quite Hill folks like us.

96	IC	((Laughs)) Like we was special, you know. ((both laugh)) But,
		yeah, it's a difference. And Homewood talks different.
